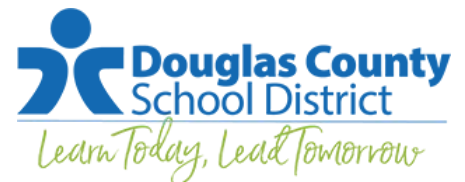


DCSD LEGACY CAMPUS

On December 15th, the Douglas County School District (DCSD) Board of Education approved a plan to purchase and renovate the former CU South and Wildlife Experience facility into a 175,000 square foot Legacy Innovation Campus. The University of Colorado (CU) South building centrally located in Lone Tree, would enable DCSD to further expand offerings for in-demand Career and Technical Education (CTE), Concurrent Enrollment (CE), and other opportunities for students to graduate prepared for careers in rapidly growing industries.
