

TRANSIT PASS OPTIONS

Of those whose employers offer transit passes:

 \longrightarrow **27%** actually use the pass to commute to work, **46%** use for recreational purposes

Of those whose employers do not offer a pass:

> 81% would use the pass for recreational purposes, 20% would use it to commute to and from work





TOP 3 NECESSARY IMPROVEMENTS TO CYCLE MORE

Safer riding conditions (e.g. wider/separated bike lanes, improved driver behavior and enhanced road repair)

Clearer route signage/wayfinding from my home to Denver South

More covered/secure bike parking 4% at my worksite

Closer amenities (e.g. restaurants, parks or entertainment)

Safer walking conditions (e.g. wider and/or complete sidewalks, improved driver behavior)

ZERO FARE FOR BETTER AIR

70% of respondents were aware of Zero Fare for Better Air, which allowed people to ride light-rail, bus and flex-ride services at no cost in July-August 2023

"Where did you take RTD transit during the Zero Fare for Better Air campaign?"











